Project Progress

The WWMC facility successfully underwent the first full test of 24 hour functionality for block 1 & 2 in December. This is to test the plant can receive and process the contracted waste volumes for full operation, in preperation for more detailed commissioning tests due to begin in Q1 2024. The facility received and processed 5,580 tonnes in the 24 hour period, exceeding the design throughput.
